SCHOOL DRESS CODE REMINDER:

The BHNCDSB believes that proper dress for pupils helps to create a positive and safe Catholic learning environment consistent with the mission and values of the Board. The responsibility for meeting the expectations of the Dress Code is primarily that of the parents/guardians of the students. All students attire must be in keeping with our Catholic teachings and beliefs, reflect principles of modesty, and shall include the following:

- 1. No clothing with inappropriate logos, sayings, and/or pictures.
- 2. Midriffs should not be exposed.
- 3. Pants are to be worn at the waist undergarments are not to be visible.
- 4. Shorts/skirts are to be an appropriate length for the student. A student may be asked to call home for a change of clothes if their shorts/skirt is deemed to be too short.

SCHOOL SAFETY:

As part of the Ministry's "Safe Welcome Program" for Elementary Schools, all doors to the school will remain locked, including the main entrance (you must use the intercom to enter the building).

PARKING— The school and board parking lot gets very busy and congested at the beginning and end of the school day. Please park in a designated St. Patrick's spot, the larger of the two parking lots, or park on the street. Please do not park in the circular drop off zone in the morning.

Please do not block the taxi/bus driveway or park in the clearly marked Fire Routes or Board Office spaces. Please note that the City of Brantford enforces the by-laws in our parking lot and non-compliance may result in a ticket being issued.

If you are dropping off or picking up your child before or after school at the gate on Fairview Drive, please make sure it is latched securely after you enter/leave.

Prevalent Student Medical Conditions

If your child has a prevalent medical condition that requires support or monitoring, we request that you contact the school as soon as possible to ensure that our staff have the necessary information to ensure your child is safe while at school.

The following are medical conditions that require a **Plan of Care** as determined by Brant Haldimand Norfolk Catholic District School Board policy and/or provincial legislation. The **Plan of Care** will be completed in collaboration with the school administrative team:

- Asthma Please complete the Asthma Plan of Care
- Anaphylactic Reactions Please complete the Anaphylaxis Plan of Care
- Diabetes Please complete the Diabetes Plan of Care
- Epilepsy Please complete the Epilepsy Plan of Care

If your child has any of the aforementioned conditions and you have not yet completed the required forms, please contact the school immediately to provide the necessary information and receive a copy of the required forms.

Please note: It is the responsibility of parents to notify schools of any medical concerns and to update the Plans of Care on an annual basis.

School Cash ONLINE (SCO)

St. Patrick School uses only SCO for all payments (trips, pizza days, etc.). Cash and cheques are not accepted.

Again this year, mandatory school forms, for example the parent permission form to allow your child to use technology at school are also posted on SCO. Please check SCO for these forms.

Most items are online for one to two weeks to allow ample time to pay. Please ensure you receive a receipt at the end of your transaction to confirm completion of payment. You can also check your history tab to make sure that your orders are complete.

Forms should not be submitted to the office until payment has been completed in SCO.

CELL PHONES

If your child brings a cell phone to school for safety reasons our school rule is cell phones are to be "off and out of site". If students need to contact families we request that students come to the office and the school secretary or administrator will assist with contacting a family member. If students are using their cell phone, without teacher permission, the following consequences will occur:

First Offence: Warning occurs.

Second Offence: Parents will be notified.

FIRE DRILLS AND LOCKDOWN DRILLS

The Ministry of Education requires that all schools conduct a minimum of 6 fire drills (3 in the fall and 3 in the spring) and 2 lockdown drills (1 in the fall and 1 in the spring) each school year. We will have conversations with all classes and review/practise procedures. Please reassure your child(ren), that fire drills and lockdown drills are necessary and remind them that it is important to follow procedures quietly and attentively. Although the chances of having an actual fire alarm or lockdown are very small, it is important that we practice and understand what to do in case of an emergency.

Monthly Celebration Assemblies:

In Connection with the Catholic Graduate Expectations and Fruits of the Holy Spirit we will be celebrating our Catholic Character Attributes with a monthly Principal award and Classroom Awards. Classes will be volunteering to share the next months attribute at our monthly assembly, at the end of each month. Ask you child(ren) about our "Caught ya! Awards". Students who are caught acting kindly or following our Character Attributes may be recognized with a Caught Ya award in their classroom. Caught Ya award winners will have their name entered in a weekly draw.
